

GUIDELINES FOR ATTENDING IN-PERSON WORSHIP

Lord remains our refuge and strength, "an ever-present help in trouble" (Psalm 46:1).
To trust in the Lord amid trouble is to experience and bear witness to the power of Christ.

Our safety measures for in-person worship: If you are sick; have an underlying condition; have been in contact with someone who has tested positive for COVID-19, or feel hesitant at all about attending the worship service, please refrain from coming to worship. Know that your presence will be missed and we invite you to join the Zoom Worship Service.

Before You Arrive:

- Check for symptoms like fever of 100.4, cough, runny nose, loss of taste or smell. If symptoms are present, please stay at home and/or seek medical help.
- Use booking system in advance to reserve your attendance. (50 people capacity limit)
- Make sure you have a face mask to bring and wear.

When You Arrive:

- Doors will be opened 10 minutes prior to the start of worship.
- Enter only in marked doorways. Pews and floors will be marked as well.
- Contactless infrared temperature checks upon entering the building.
- Wear a face mask at all times. Make sure it covers both nose & mouth for everyone over the age of 2.
- Maintain 6 ft. physical distancing from others. If accompanied, remain with your group.
- Wash your hands and use sanitizer often. (Hand sanitizer available at entrance and exit)
- Follow all one way traffic patterns and guidance of ushers.
- Remain in your assigned pew area.
- No hugs or handshakes or high fives or fist bumps.
- No congregational singing.
- Leave your offering in the offertory plates located at the back of the sanctuary or mail it to the church.

After the Service:

- You will be dismissed by pews. Please follow the instructions of ushers.
- Use only designated exit doors.
- Practice physical distancing and continue to wear your face mask.
- No congregating in the parking lot or church.
